
...AND NOTHING BUT THE TRUTH

hen I first got into police work in 1979, I was your typical rookie: excited to wear that shiny badge and eager to get out on the road. When the dispatcher called my unit number, it was another adventure about to happen. Yes, that gets tempered as the months and years wear on, but I always loved my job up until maybe the last year when I was itching to get out.

I'm no different than most in that way. Most of us "love" the job at some point or another or maybe every day of our career, but how about *passion?* How many of us can use that word and plug it into our personal law enforcement narrative? I guess early on I had a passion for it. Maybe that morphed into something else when I went to homicide. It was a drive, a commitment, a resolve, to close the case for the victim's family and for my own sense of my role in the justice system.

You want passion for law enforcement – passion which is almost fanatical? Meet Terry Grosz.

This man was a game warden for 32 years all over the west and northwest areas of the country. You only have to listen to him for two minutes – though I heard the entire NPR interview the other day – to hear the passion come through his voice when he recounts his career. He loved the job so much and he was so proud of what he did that he wrote books about it, one of them being, Wildlife Wars: The Life and Times of a Fish and Game Warden.

You are reading that right - "of a fish and game warden," not the chief prosecutor of some major metropolitan area; not the SAC of an FBI office - a fish and game warden. I think most of us have been around long enough to know that he probably didn't make a ton of money. But, when you listen to Grosz, you understand very quickly that money was not his calling. He cares so much for the environment, for wildlife and for the protection of our natural resources that he went to incredible lengths to do his job. You know how we joke about some people "taking the job too seriously"? Maybe his colleagues joked about him that way, too, but somehow I get the feeling that Grosz didn't care. He had taken more than a legal oath to do his job as a game warden. He operated on a much deeper level, a personal commitment to nature which

drove him to devote every ounce of effort he could to keep endangered animals from being poached. He told tales of many animals which were killed or trapped unlawfully. The experiences frustrated him as a lawman, but hurt him as a caretaker of the environment. He once laid in a marsh for nearly three days to catch commercial duck hunters who were pulverizing the mallard duck population in one area. He was shot by another duck hunter and ended up at the hospital where they dug 189 shotgun pellets out of his skin. One story in particular was nothing less than riveting to hear on the radio because he told it well. What he did to catch a group of illegal fisherman was nothing less than remarkable.

I've done many surveillances for many different types of crimes and, currently, I'm doing it for civil cases. Back in the early '80s, before I went to homicide, I worked on a squad in which we did lots of surveillances to catch auto thieves, burglars and robbers. In homicide, we did many surveillances over the years to catch wanted subjects or just investigate groups of offenders to determine relationships. I've been on rooftops, alleyways, boats, and even in a tree, in all types of weather and at all hours of the day or night. Once, I even wore the uniform of a fast-food chicken place. But, I've never ever done anything like what Terry Grosz did - and I doubt you have either.

Grosz was trying to find some fishermen who were decimating the salmon population in a California pond where the



fish began their upstream spawning journey. Because of this location, the area was off-limits to fishing. This determined group of poachers, however, was going in at night and using a special lure which glowed in a way that the salmon found irresistible. The fishermen were cleaning up big-time and Grosz agonized over how to stop them. The spot was remote and difficult to access, especially in the dark wilderness. He finally came up with a plan. He would don a wet suit and swim the cold waters of a stream which led to the pond. With a citation book and a flashlight inside a zippered waterproof pouch tucked inside the wet suit, Grosz – 6' 4" and 300 pounds – entered the pitch-black waters and started a long, chilly trip toward the outlaw anglers.

As he got closer, he could see the lures arcing through the inky sky as the fishermen made their casts and he could hear their voices. Using a thick leather welder's glove on one hand, he made a couple of attempts to get himself hooked. When the barb finally snagged his glove, he slapped the water and tugged at the line to simulate a struggling salmon. Edging ever closer to the group, he heard the fisherman excitedly exclaim to his buddies, "It's a big one!"

They would soon find out how big.

Only Grosz can adequately explain how carefully and skill-fully he had to act like a hooked salmon to keep the ruse going as long as he possibly could. When his feet touched bottom, he knew he would have to act fast. He used the darkness to cloak his true identity up until the last second, when he emerged from the

water to stand – like the Creature from the Black Lagoon indeed – before his astounded quarry.

He announced his official capacity to the three men who stood in shocked silence. "You are under arrest," he told them as he took out his citation book from his dripping wet suit. He calmly recorded their names and identification and issued the citations. Then, because the materials they used to catch the fish were illegal and needed to be impounded as evidence, he gathered up their fishing rods, waded back into the pond, and swam away.

I would have loved to have seen the faces on those men.

Terry Grosz was the "Sergeant York" of our national parks and protected wildlife. He leaves little doubt that, to be really good at one's job, you have to love what you are doing and what you are protecting.

Thanks, Terry Grosz, for your service. I won't enjoy nature again without thinking of you. P&\$N



The Ten Commandments of Managing a Bad Boss: Part II

THERE ARE SOME SIMPLE RULES TO FOLLOW IF YOU WANT TO HAVE A PRODUCTIVE AND POSITIVE RELATIONSHIP WITH YOUR BOSS.



It was often easy to avoid your sergeant when you were a patrol officer, but now that you are a sergeant or supervisor, you'll often spend a great deal of time working with your boss. After all, you're now on the "management team." If your lieutenant or commander (or whatever title they have) is inept or just a "jerk," you must learn how to work with or "manage" them. If you don't, then your chances of becoming a successful sergeant are slim and your chances of having a successful career may be about as good as winning the recent Powerball lottery.

Managing your boss means working with him (or her). You were promoted to be part of the management team and this means management expects you to be a "team player" – not an antagonist. In Part I of this article (in the last issue of *P&SN*), we listed the first five "commandments" of learning how to manage a bad boss. Let's finish off with the last five.



Commandments Six Through Ten

6. Work "with" your boss - Every boss, no matter how good or bad, has certain needs which he expects subordinates to fulfill and certain expectations for his subordinates to meet. Your boss expects you to meet his expectations (whether you agree with them or not) and make his job easier (not yours). Of course, the more insecure and incompetent a boss is, the more likely that his expectations will not agree with yours. Also, insecure bosses view an employee or subordinate who whines, complains or who questions every decision as someone who is making their job more difficult and as someone who is not a team player.

Every boss expects his (or her) subordinates to be loyal; support his (or her) decisions; meet his (or her) objectives; share information; show respect; be a team player; and make him (or her) look good.

If you <u>aren't</u> doing these things, then you are giving your boss a reason to retaliate against you. You are no longer a team player and, therefore, may be viewed as a liability to your boss (and your department) instead of an asset.

7. "Help" your boss – Analyze your boss. Figure out what makes him "tick"; how he operates; what his strengths and weaknesses are; and what he "needs." It may sound like a lot of work (especially if he is a jerk!), but the results can be beneficial to him and to you. Once the analysis is done, you can begin to "help" your boss.

Start with the little things. For example, when is the best time to talk with him about a problem? Maybe it's first thing in the morning; maybe it's after lunch, etc. Timing can be critical in creating a positive working relationship. What about his personality? Is he an aggressive, overbearing jerk who growls like a bear about everything or is he a passive, wimpy recluse who hides in his office and silently prays for the end of the shift? Either way, you're stuck with him! You will not change his personality, so you have some choices you can adjust to his personality or you can create serious problems for yourself by constantly rubbing him the wrong way! I suggest you accept him and deal with it in the best positive way you can (without a doubt, this is easier said than done).

Find out what his strengths are. What

does he do well? (Hopefully, something.) If so, learn from him. Ask him to show you or train you. Give him an honest compliment if he does something worthwhile.

Find out what his weaknesses are: not so that you can take advantage of this as you watch him fail, but so that you can help him succeed (this can be very difficult to do, especially if you don't like him). You may have to offer to take on some additional work. For example, your boss might have some problems doing an administrative task. You can't go into his office and say, "Lieutenant, you keep screwing up the applications for federal grants and that's why we never get any!" (That's the chief's job.) But, you could say something like, "Lieutenant, I'd like to gain a little experience writing grants. Could I look over your shoulder when you do the next one and then, maybe, I can take a crack at doing one or two on my own?" In this way, you are nonthreatening; a team player; and you aren't a hotshot, but someone who is willing to "learn." Your boss will end up doing less work because you're doing it. It's true that you end up with more work, but the job gets done and you get a chance to learn more skills than if you kept your mouth shut and watched him sink! (Of course, don't expect your boss to give you any credit if the grant comes through - he will tell the chief what a great job he did.)

8. Don't threaten your boss - Weak bosses have a very low tolerance for subordinates who are sharp, competent or even do work beyond the minimums. Why? You are a threat to them. They can easily view you as sizing up their chair and desk to fit you. How do you avoid threatening your boss? Try to eliminate as many negative emotions as possible in dealing with him: Don't give him the "silent treatment"; don't leave the room when he enters; don't buy every one coffee except him; and don't treat him with anything less than respect. Your boss needs support, especially if he realizes that he lacks management skills. The best way to show your support for your boss is to be an ally, not an enemy.

9. Train your people – If you are a good supervisor and you are good at making your boss look good, he may not help you get a transfer or promotion. You are too good – and because you are too good, you are being punished! How can you avoid this trap? Train the people who work for you!

How will training your subordinates

improve your chances of a transfer or a promotion? You don't have a choice – you can either be considered too valuable and give your boss a reason to deny your transfer OR you can train your subordinates to get the job done even if you're not there.

Don't be threatened by training your subordinates! Bad bosses are threatened by subordinates who might know something more than they know. Don't fall for this – you want the best trained people possible on your shift. Training your

people will improve their morale, increase productivity, reduce grievances, and allow you to delegate some of your workload. More importantly, you will have subordinates who want to come to work and do their job.

10. Are you part of the problem? – What positive things are you doing in your

position? Have you become a problem instead of a solution? Remember that it takes two to disagree. What are you doing that makes a bad situation worse? What problems are you bringing to the job which affect your subordinates? As clearly as you see all of the faults and problems of your boss, so, too, do your subordinates see your faults and problems. Are you creating problems for your boss? Remember, bad bosses have long memories and they can affect your career long after you leave their shift or unit.

Conclusion

There's no need to remind you that your boss can undermine your career in many different ways. His boss usually only

> sees you through him. Bad bosses can paint a bleak picture of your performance, attitude and your ability to do your job. A well chosen word or two by your boss can cause a great deal of damage to your career and you may never know what happened. Of course, this can impact your career, whether you are looking for a lateral move or a special assignment or a promotion. (Remember, they are looking for "team players"!) If your boss is a "survivor" (someone whose career is based on the Peter Principle), then he knows many ways of subtly making other people look bad without making it obvious that he is the problem. So, if you are continually butting heads with your boss, you

should take a good look in the mirror and see what you are doing to help <u>or</u> hurt the situation. Remember that, during your career, you will work for a lot more bad bosses than good bosses. Sooner or later, your career and your subordinates may depend on how you handle a bad boss. This involves patience, swal-

lowing a little pride, good communication skills and focusing on the positives. P&SN


Turn of the Century Weapon Light

The combination revolver and dark lantern (circa 1902) shown in the above illustration was thought to be of great value in case of an emergency at night. Its distinguishing feature was the small incandescent light bulb mounted in a reflector tube which was located below the revolver barrel. The battery – located in the grip of the revolver – was electrically connected to the bulb by applying a slight amount of pressure to the trigger. Thus, should a homeowner suspect a burglar to be in his house, he could use his revolver as a "dark lantern" to find his man and insure proper aim before firing. As soon as the revolver was fired, the trigger would then return to its normal position and separate the electric wires, thus affording the operator the protection of darkness.


Unfortunately, there were those who believed that this invention was as useful in the hands of a burglar as it was to the homeowner.



The 25th Annual Roundup Covering New Firearms of Most Interest to Law Enforcement

or those unfamiliar with the annual Sporting, Hunting and Outdoor Trade (SHOT) Show, it's a huge gathering of almost everything and anything related to firearms, as well as to other outdoor activities. Here, we look at firearms and, more specifically, firearms suitable for law enforcement and personal self-defense.

New and current (but revised) handguns and, in particular, small, easy to conceal handguns were most prolific at the show again this year. In the category of new versions of full-sized handguns, the majority were striker-fired and made with polymer and steel. To this mix was added handguns set up to accept a mini Red Dot (RD) sight, as well as more handguns configured to accept a suppressor (silencer). (Note: A separate federal law must be followed for personal ownership of the latter.)

While the demand (you might say "mania") for the "modern sporting rifle" has moderated, new versions, calibers and configurations still appear. Now, let's take a look at some of the many guns at SHOT.



Beretta Defense Technologies (www.beretta.com)

Beretta has reworked its Px4 model for concealed carry, labeling it the Px4 CC (Compact Carry). The new Px4 CC expands Beretta's polymer framed, double-action/single-action pistols for service and self-defense. This new version is a decocker only pistol without manual safeties and with low profile controls including the ambidextrous decocker levers and slide stop. The Px4 CC comes with three sizes of magazine buttons for a person-

alized grip. The guns will ship with wraparound TALON™ grips, too, for even more grip options.

The slide has a dark gray Cerakote™ finish for extra wear resistance and to make it stand out from the rest of the Px4 series. It also comes with a set of high visibility AmeriGlo day and night sights, and the Px4 CC has an improved trigger pack which is even lighter and smoother than the standard Px4 trigger. Additionally, it ships with three 15 round magazines, one more than standard. The MSRP will be +/-\$850.

Colt® Defense, LLC (www.colt.com)

Colt introduced three new products for 2016: the Colt Competition Pistol™ in 9x19mm or .45ACP (MSRP – \$899); the Colt Lightweight Commander® (MSRP – \$949); and the Colt Expanse™ M4 Carbine (MSRP – \$699). According to Colt, the guns are proposed for, respectively, competition; concealed carry; and, in the case of the M4, the first time AR buyer looking for a starting point on which to

build a task specific carbine. The Expanse M4 also puts a basic Colt AR-15 within reach of shooters looking to enhance their collections and is upgradable with the addition of a forward assist and dustcover.

Daniel Defense®, Inc. (www.danieldefense.com)

Daniel Defense announced the DD5V1 rifle chambered in 7.62x51mm NATO (.308). It has a four bolt connection system, optimized upper receiver, improved bolt carrier group, ambidextrous controls, modular charging handle and a cold hammer forged barrel. It also has a Geissele® SSA two-stage trigger, DD Superior Suppression Device (all federal

FN America, LLC (www.fnamerica.com)

Although FN's Military Collectors Series (semiautomatic versions of the

U.S. military's standard issue rifles) received a great deal of attention at this year's event, FN also touted a couple of new additions to its line of car-

30 rounds of .300 AAC Blackout (7.62x35mm) and has additional special features such as a match-grade barrel, free-float forearm, Magpul butt stock, pistol grip and a SureFire ProComp muzzle brake. With an overall length of 37" (stock fully extended) and a weight of 6.6 pounds (empty), the MSRP is listed as \$1479.



The GLOCK handgun retains its dominance of the handgun industry and is the most represented in

law enforcement. If you see an armed law-man, chances are he's carrying a GLOCK.

bines – the FN 15[™] Patrol Carbine SBR 10.5 and the FN 15 Tactical .300 Blk. The

SBR 10.5 shares many of the operating features as the standard FN 15 Carbine; however, it has additional

special features such as a flip up rear sight. Chambered in 5.56x45mm with a 30 round magazine, it has a barrel length of 10.5" and an overall length of 26.5" with a collapsed stock.

Weighing in at 5.92 pounds (empty), a 14.5" barrel option is also available.

The FN 15 Tactical .300 Blk holds

Two of GLOCK®s best-selling pistols are now able to mount a variety of reflex-style red dot optics to their slide.

This use may well expand now that GLOCK offers subcompact pistols in .380ACP and 9x19mm – the models 42 and 43 – which are very strong sellers.

Of note, last year, GLOCK introduced the Modular Optic System (MOS) for a few of their full-sized models, but not for the two most commonly owned – the Models 17 and 19. This has now been rectified. Now, two of GLOCK's best-selling pistols are available with milled slides designed specifically to be adaptable to multiple optic systems without costly customization. The G17 Gen4 MOS and G19 Gen4 MOS are now available for use with reflex sights. Both models are chambered in 9mm and do not differ in specifications from their respective standard models. They both have an MSRP of \$726.

Kahr Arms® (www.kahr.com)

Kahr has been busy updating its line as shown by the Gen2 P9. This single stack 9mm pistol features a 3.5" barrel and holds 7+1 rounds. It now has a shorter, sharper, trigger let off, an accessory rail and TruGlo® TFX sights. The Gen2 line's MSRP ranges from \$976 to \$668.

Interestingly, Kimber has finally introduced a revolver, labeled the K6s[™]. It's a "snubby" six-shooter chambered in .357 Magnum! Old-timers will see a strong

resemblance to the long discontinued Colt Detective Special Series, while those not so old may see the very short-lived Colt Magnum Carry revolver, also in .357 Magnum. Others might just see a good-looking, hammerless, double-action-only pocket revolver holding six rounds and weighing 23 ounces. It has fixed, but removable, sights; its frame and cylinder are stainless steel; and its edges are rounded. Included will be a pair of Kimber branded speed strips. The K6s has an MSRP of \$899.

Remington (www.remington.com)

Remington has a new pocket pistol, the Remington RM380 Semiauto Micro



Pistol. It's a double-action-only gun which holds 6+1 rounds of .380ACP and weighs a shade over 12 ounces. Barrel length is 2.9", overall length specs out at 5.27" and it stands 3.86" tall. In side view, it looks a bit like my .32ACP Seecamp. The RM380 ships with two magazines, one of which has an extended base pad. Its MSRP is \$436.



Ruger® Firearms (www.ruger.com/le)

Ruger made a splash with its new full-sized steel and polymer handgun named the American Pistol™. It's chambered for either 9x19mm or .45ACP with barrel lengths and weights of 4.20" and 30 ounces and 4.5" and 31.5 ounces, respectively. It uses a pretensioned striker system and a modular wraparound grip system which addresses palm swell and trigger reach.

Also, a new feature has been added – a recoil reducing barrel cam which, it is claimed, better spreads recoil over time when the gun is discharged. This, coupled with a low mass slide, low center of gravity and low bore axis provides better balance, less felt recoil and less muzzle flip.

Both Americans have Novak® LoMount Carry three dot sights; a stainless steel slide with black nitride finish; a one-piece, glass filled nylon grip frame; and a Mil-Standard 1913 accessory rail. They ship with replaceable grip modules and two nickel Teflon® plated steel magazines (a 17 round magazine for 9mm and

In addition to having a push-button magazine release, the company also reshaped much of the gun to make it sleeker – both visually and practically. With either long guns or handguns, there is no lack of new items for most any law enforcement or civilian self-defense need. Considering the numerous choices of small, easy to conceal handguns (with qualities ranging from mediocre to out-

SUV and Pickup Accessories for Law Enforcement

Sergeant James Post

ere at *Police and Security News*, it is our mission to keep our readers in the fields of Law Enforcement (LE) and Homeland Security informed of new products – from weapons to vehicles and uniforms to equipment – which will make their jobs easier and safer. And, if we are able to help you save some money along the way, well, that's the icing on the cake for us.

I've written several times about the nationwide law enforcement shift from passenger sedans - first to SUVs and, now, to pickup trucks. The Big Three have been eager to step up with larger vehicles as the sedans have shrunk in size. There are noticeable exceptions, of course, but, by and large, cruisers have been downsized in an era with more equipment both in the car and on an officer's duty belt. Unfortunately, there is no breed of smaller cops to squeeze into these minicruisers. In fact, if anything, today's officers are larger due to better health decisions and rigid physical regimens. When it came to the point that only one


officer could fit in the front seat of a squad car, or the confines were uncomfortable for even an eight hour tour, something had to be done.

First came the Tahoes, followed by the Durangos and, lastly, the Interceptor Utility. Somewhere along the way, agencies also discovered the amazing resale value of the SUVs, with many used units selling near 75% of its MSRP. The increased cost of moving up to an SUV is now offset considerably at tour's end.

We've also previously discussed the many reasons to consider SUVs. Besides improving your officers' comfort, the primary benefit gained is enhanced officer safety due to the higher stance. An officer's visibility is increased dramatically, allowing him (or her) to observe his (or her) surroundings better; see into most stopped vehicles with ease; and improve the ability to quickly surveil areas like congested parking lots and crowds. The SUVs have more glass, allowing for nearly 360° vision. The greater visibility has an impact on officer safety because the taller vehicles can be seen by motorists easier - both in traffic and when they are stationary.

SUVs can accept more equipment than sedans while providing ample seating for officers and prisoners alike. Because of the additional capacity gained in the rear, they are ideal for K-9, CSI, commercial weight enforcement and field sergeants – all of which require more space.

Following the switch to LE SUVs, the aftermarket suppliers jumped onboard

with model specific equipment like consoles, computer mounts, weapon racks, prisoner partitions and seating. Emergency lighting is now available in configurations to fit the SUVs and some desired equipment can be ordered from the factory and installed (by upfitters) prior to delivery.

Keep on Truckin'

Following the popularity of LE SUVs, it was a no-brainer that LE designed pickup trucks would soon follow for many of the same reasons, such as resale and visibility. Now, there are Special Service (LE) pickups available from Chevrolet, Ford and Ram. All are

full-size, four door "crew cab" versions, providing the same carrying capacity for officers and prisoners as SUVs. For climates and terrains requiring it, they are also available in 4WD. The big difference between trucks and SUVs is that whatever you put in the back of a pickup is visible to the world, but there are solutions for that, too. Most major police equipment manufacturers offer consoles, weapon mounts and prisoner partitions for the three

trucks, but the purpose of this article is a review of available exterior equipment and accessories.

Think Outside the Box

With the expanding use of pickups in law enforcement throughout North America, I realized that many aftermarket truck accessories already available in the marketplace could be used for Special Service trucks. This notion prompted my decision to attend the annual

SEMA Show last November. "Wait," you say, "isn't SEMA that event full of scantly-clad models, big wheels and tires, custom cars and hot rods?" Well, yes, but there is a lot more.

SEMA stands for the Specialty Equipment Market Association and their annual event in Las Vegas is a huge display of virtually every aftermarket accessory available for every vehicle built in the world. It's that simple and that complex and, as I expected, I discovered many equipment vendors offering truck accessories easily adaptable for Special Service duty.

What Gives?

Being a student of automotive designs and trends for nearly 60 years, I've developed a long list of "What the hell?" observations and the list keeps growing. I wonder about things like, "Do the designers of the front end of a new car ever consult with the guys designing the rear?" Or, "If engineers ever have to actually work on an engine or even replace a headlight, would they design them better to simplify the tasks?"

The Basics

There are a wide variety of camper shells and bed covers on the market which are excellent for keeping bed contents dry, but may not provide the security needed for police work. Fiberglass paintable shells can be found with a choice of side windows or solid side panels (which are perfect for your graphics) and locking rear windows. There are roll up covers, hard covers and fold up covers, most with optional locks. Again, if these are accessories you are considering, be certain to check them for security first. This article will not cover these, as the variety is nearly endless.

There are some items which I consider basic accessories for an LE pickup. Almost mandatory is some form of side steps or running boards. Since these trucks sit higher (particularly 4x4s) than the sedans, your officers may be used to these steps (rails) which will make entry and exit safer and easier. Many are available in full-length styles which mount under all four doors, aiding prisoner placement as well. Some companies offer "wheel to wheel" length rails which also have a step at the rear to help access the pickup bed. Side rails and running boards are generally frame mounted and will protect your rocker panels, too. Your local car dealership may offer them with your purchase and they are readily available in the marketplace, too; however, many meant for civilian use (decoration) are not rugged enough for the hardships of your job.

Rough, Tough and Ready for Duty

Following we will discuss several companies – both from the vendors at SEMA and from the pages of *P&SN* as well – which manufacture side steps, skid plates and other accessories you should consider for your SUVs and pickups,

American Aluminum Accessories, Inc. (www.ezrideronline.com)

American Aluminum manufactures a wide variety of products from high quality accessories to meet the ever changing needs of the LE community. Their CamLocker boxes come in a variety of configurations to meet your needs. Their heavy-duty toolboxes ride on a pickup bed's side rails and their Vault Systems are rugged compartments for the popular SUVs. They are custom-built with a variety of drawers and a top rack. They are excellent storage for weapons, ammo and tactical gear. American Aluminum also offers K-9 compartments. All CamLocker products are American made

The front and side bars are available for all of the large SUVs and the cargo headache rack is something you definitely should consider if you plan to leave your pickup's bed uncovered. ARIES also offers two other styles of running boards for all of the LE SUVs and trucks: AeroTread™, a rail system in aluminum, and RidgeStep™, a steel step which resembles vintage running boards.

Bodyguard® Truck Accessories (www.bodyguardbumpers.com)

Bodyguard builds replacement front and rear bumpers for all of the popular pickups and steps for utilities and trucks. Their A2 Series of front bumpers are a smooth plate construction which mount directly to the truck's frame with several LED lighting options and include a front skid plate. There are four variations of this bumper, all offering full frontal protection. This type of bumper is usually associated with farm duty; however, these would be excellent on SWAT vehicles. Bodyguard's

T2 Steps are made of 2" x 6" rectangular tubing and feature bolt on step pads. They are available in 2DR, 4DR or wheel to wheel styles and have a factory appearance. The Pipe Steps are even more rugged with a construction of 4 1/2" O.D. pipe and fit close to the body.

CargoGlide® (www.cargoglide.com)

CargoGlide offers American made slide out pickup bed trays for Chevy, Ford and Ram trucks. They are available in 70% and 100% extensions and in all bed lengths. These mount directly into a truck's bed and allow you ready accessibility to whatever your payload may be. These could also be covered with a shell or bed cover for additional security. CargoGlide's truck trays are offered in varying weight capacities, from 1000 pounds to 2200 pounds, allowing you to transport heavy loads such as portable scales. They offer a number of accessories, such as tray dividers and tie-downs, and all of this is accomplished without removing the factory tailgate.

The Diamond Tread Steps are heavy-duty and more likely to be considered for LE duty. Also of a tubular design, they feature a full-length 1/8" diamond tread step plate on top. Powder coated black, they are available in three lengths as well.

Innovative Creations, Inc. (www.accessoryproshop.com)

Innovative Creations, Inc. (ICI) has a full line of pickup truck accessories suitable for LE applications. Their aptly named Magnum Bumpers are OEM replacement bumpers which make a bold statement, protect grilles and wrap around to offer front fender protection as well. American made from cold rolled steel, there are a bunch of available accessories, too. ICI also offers two styles of side steps for all the popular makes. Magnum RT Steps present a different style of entry. These are bolt on single steps with nonslip diamond plate tread which mount

directly under each of the truck's doors. ICI's Rocker Armor would be a smart addition to any vehicle you plan to use off road or on gravel roads. It is a black flexible material which is adhesive backed and cut to fit to mount on your vehicle's rocker panels, protecting them and increasing your resale value.

LUND International, Inc. (www.lundinternational.com)

LUND is a provider of many superior LE products. Their new line of Terrain HX Steps™ is no exception. They combine the best features of side rails with steps for the popular LE trucks. They are an aggressively designed, yet functional, nerf





The University offers an Undergraduate Certificate in the Fundamentals of Criminal Justice. The certificate program teaches the basic facts and workings of the criminal justice system within the legal system, criminal investigations and general judicial principles. Four courses are required: Introduction to Criminal Justice, Criminal Investigation, Procedures in the Justice System, and Forensic Science.

The Associate of Science Degree in Criminal Justice is self-paced and completed off campus in an online learning format. Students can begin at any time of the year. The program requires six core courses (Introduction to Criminal Justice, Juvenile Justice, Criminal Investigation, Procedures in the Justice System, Terrorism, and Forensic Science); ten general education courses (Human Body, Environmental Science, Psychology of Adjustment, Introduction to Sociology, Introduction to Humanities, Art History, US Government, Mathematics, English, and Early US History); and four elective courses (among which are courses in management, cultural diversity, medical law and ethics, psychology, and computing).

A total of 126 semester units are required and the coursework includes 14 core courses, 14 general education courses and 14 elective courses. convert algorithms to programs; design, implement and test computer solutions for problems; and evaluate and administer computer security technologies.




