





# ...AND Nothing But The truth

think it's safe to say that, as we get older, we get more nostalgic. I say this because of the myriad posts on Twitter and Facebook about "remember this?" and "whatever happened to ....?" You've seen them and you've gotten accustomed to seeing the same stuff coming from certain people in your circle of colleagues and friends, right? There is a group of ex-cops I know who just can't seem to pull themselves out of the "old days." Hey, look, I get it. It's fun to recall old times and funny memories - every so often. One of my old buddies posts both on LinkedIn and Facebook daily, if not two to three times a day, about the great accomplishments of himself and his fellow detectives, complete with photos and newspaper clippings. There's nothing wrong with being proud of what we did, but - dare I say it? - get a life!

Another post I saw showed an American flag and the words, "I miss the America I grew up in." And, the poster said, "Can I get an amen?" I thought about it. I suppose times were simpler, but then again, we were kids. We didn't face whatever stresses our parents faced and those stresses are relative from generation to generation. I do remember - along with the good, simpler times of the 1960s - my mother being denied entry into a restaurant in Miami because of the color of her skin. I also remember my white father having a rock thrown at his car when he drove through a black neighborhood. I remember two police officers - wearing the same uniform I would



end up wearing for 27 years – coming up to my friend and me at a park and asking, "Hey, did you guys see a couple of ni---rs running through here earlier?"

That was the America I grew up in and, quite frankly, *no*, I don't miss those aspects of it at all. In the temptation to dive into a hot tub of nostalgia, I think it behooves us to carefully examine from whence we came, and measure the changes from a variety of angles, not just "it was better" or "it was worse."

Therefore, in the interest of not getting too nostalgic, I'll just turn the clock back ten years.

It was August of 2012 and I started the school year the same way I had the previous two years as a Legal Academy teacher at Coral Reef Senior High.

"How many of you," I asked the class of sophomores, "are interested in going into law enforcement?" Roughly two-thirds of the students raised their hands.

"How about lawyers?" Less than a third raised their hands and, of course, there were a few who either didn't know what they were interested in or had a completely nonlegal career interest.



Now, fast forward to August of 2022. It actually *is* a fast forward because 2012 was my last year of teaching at the school, before my recent return of just six months ago. I didn't know what was going on at the school or, for that matter, in the minds and hearts of teenagers over that ten year span. I didn't count my own kids in the equation because I couldn't really be unbiased and it wasn't enough of a sample size.

In 2022, the first thing I noticed was that most of the class had their eyes down, looking at the little electronic rectangles which rule their souls. (I don't think that's an exaggeration – if you have teenagers, I think you'll agree.)

"Put your phones away," I told them. "I want to have a conversation with you."

I can only imagine the final texts that were being hurried across space as they informed their friends about their new Legal class: *This teacher is old school...he just told us he wants to have a conversation – wtf*??

And, then I asked the same question: By a show of hands, how many of you might be interested in going into law enforcement? Out of 33 kids, maybe *five* raised their hands.

"And, do we have any future lawyers in here?" About 20 hands went up. The rest were fine with saying they didn't know yet. As we all know, their answer was the most accurate.

Yes, it was a startling difference from 2012, but is it terribly surprising? What has happened to our profession in the last ten years is akin to a famous actor or politician suddenly facing multiple accusations of sexual misconduct. But, they're still "famous." Law enforcement is still famous and it always will be. Hollywood didn't stop making cop shows and legal thrillers. Our culture devours police and investigative dramas. That is one thing which hasn't changed since the birth of film media. What has changed is social media. In 2012, Instagram was just two years old and, though it would gain ten million registered users in its first year, it had yet to put its roots down in teen culture to become the staple it is to-

day. The same with Snapchat which was barely a year old when I stood in front of that class. Reddit had been around since 2005, but didn't gain any kind of popularity until about 2015.

By the time the shooting of Michael Brown in Ferguson, Missouri, occurred in 2014, all three were hotter than a summer Miami sidewalk. We, as a profession, learned that this new social media culture has little interest in slowing down enough to evaluate information. What happens instead is that perceptions - often horribly misinformed ones - explode across the globe in seconds and get repeated and retweeted with dizzying speed and breadth. There's no time to ask questions. There's only time to share the post you saw with your hundreds of followers, with a few taps of your thumbs, in the hopes that you get "likes" and "follows." For the unprepared, there's no hope of competing with the onslaught. Law enforcement, or anyone who has the misfortune to be in the public eve, is an amateur in the ring being chased by Muhammad Ali. With social media, perception is king. Try to slow people down to explain facts and it will backfire on you. You'll find yourself on the mat, staring up at the bright lights, with the crowd cheering for your demise.

Ferguson, as we well know, was just the beginning. We were in for a string of terrible events. There would be shootings and beatings which might or might not be justified. But justification didn't matter. The concepts of right and wrong dissolved into an effigy hanging of monstrous proportions. A pinata at a birthday party wouldn't take the pummeling that our justice system would endure in the coming months and years.

This time in 2022, I dug deeper with the tinyurl.com/hwc2xajm

next of the six classes I teach. I went student by student this time, asking, "What interests do you have as a career?"

Now, the answers were more revealing.

"I want to be a detective, not a cop." (I have to hold back my smirks and comments when I hear these.)

"I want to be like those 'Criminal Minds' people."

"I want to be a CSI."

Out of 198 students, three told me that that they wanted to wear a uniform and serve their community.

Is it all bad? I don't think so. Hey, we need better attorneys and judges in our culture, too. I see this generation of high school students as more willing to tolerate the opinions of others. They are much more polite. They do things I didn't see in 2012, like holding doors open for teachers and *thanking* me for teaching them.

I warn them about social media. I urge them to think about things, ask questions and investigate before they repeat them. I tell them not to be sheep.

Time will tell. And, ten years from today, maybe this place will be an America we feel better about being in. **P&SN**

# Celebrating the Life of DICK KRAMER 1938-2022

D ick Kramer, U.S. Navy veteran and acclaimed artist and illustrator, 83, passed away January 14, 2022, at his home in Leesburg, VA, beside his beloved family.

Known by many as the "Father of Modern Tactical Artwork," Dick Kramer produced the finest in tactical art for first responders, as well as military themed art prints. According to Dick, these represent the brightest, bravest and best our nation has to offer.

Mr. Kramer was born on April 1, 1938, in Newark, NJ. From a very young age, Dick had a calling to art and would draw on anything he could get his hands on. In fact, one of his first jobs was for a local butcher and he was paid in the brown paper which would be used to wrap the various meats in the shop. After attending Nutley High School, Dick enlisted in the United States Navy at the age of 17 and became the youngest 2nd Class Petty Officer in the Pacific Fleet, serving as an Aviation Ordnanceman. Dick would refer to his decision

> to join the Navy as the best decision he ever made, second only to his decision to propose to his wife, Virginia. They would marry soon after Dick's honorable discharge in 1959.

> > Dick quickly returned to his pursuit of art, attending the Newark School of Art and the School of Visual Arts in New York City at night. With the birth of twin boys, Richard and Robert, in 1960, money was tight and Dick would work various jobs during the day, including selling vacuum cleaners door-to-door to provide for the growing family.



Dick was ordained a Deacon in 1976 at St. Joseph's Church in Newark. This would be a lasting source of pride for Dick as he worked to serve Christ throughout his life. Always dedicated to the service of his country, a few years later, Dick and his daughter, Suzanne, would make New Jersey history as the first father and daughter to graduate from the same police academy – the Essex County Police Academy in Verona, NJ. They would go on to serve together as Special Deputy Sheriffs.

In the following years, Dick would flourish as an artist, working as a freelance illustrator in New York City for many notable clients such as Grosset & Dunlap, Bell Telephone, and the National Football League to name a few. During this time, he was accepted into the prestigious Society of Illustrators.

In 1981, Dick accepted a position as a staff artist for the defense contractor ITT to support their military programs. He would go on to paint over 60 original paintings for the Air Force Art Program, including what would become one of the

defining works of his life. In 1987, Dick would paint an enormous sixteen by eight-foot mural honoring the 40th anniversary of the Berlin Airlift which he would present to President Ronald Reagan hours before his historic "Mr. Gorbachev, tear down this wall" speech at Brandenburg Gate. This mural hangs in honor at Berlin's Templehof Airport and will soon be transferred to the Allied Museum.

An unapologetic, America-loving patriot, Dick would open his own studio with his wife, Ginny, and spend the rest of his career honoring the military and law enforcement, whom he loved so deeply, through his art. Dick would go on to create hundreds of pieces of art profiling every type of first responder and elite unit imaginable. He has been the recipient of countless awards from police and military organizations including the Department of Homeland Security for his skillful depiction of these heroes. He was named Entrepreneur of the Year by the Loudoun County Chamber of Commerce in 1998 and Citizen of the Year by the city of Purcellville, VA, in 2014.

# Seven Steps to Launching a Successful Police Department Drone Program

Starting a drone program is a significant undertaking and may be intimidating if you have no experience launching a new technological program.

here are many considerations at every step of the journey – from equipment startup costs to figuring out how many batteries you'll need and where you'll operate in terms of airspace. These factors take time and resources, even for experienced operators.

Starting a drone program requires dedicated supplies, support and experience. Here, I'll walk you through seven steps you'll need to follow to get your drone program off the ground.

### **Step 1: Ideation and Planning**

Launching your drone program will require dedicated and tailored planning and consideration. Finding the right partner with resources dedicated to helping your agency develop the proper training programs is key and will help save you both time and money.



### **Step 2: Acquire Funding**

Public safety agencies often experience funding roadblocks when starting a drone program. To follow are a few ideas and strategies to build, launch and receive support for a new public sector drone program.

 Grants – There are a number of grant opportunities available to first responders, with some of these being ongoing programs. Although, in most cases, you may be limited to what airframe you can buy. Certain restrictions include stipulations from government grants which only allow for USA-made drones. If you intend to apply for those types of grants, make sure to check the Blue List for confirmation on authorized gear.

It's necessary to help the public understand what the program will offer and what it will be used for which may eventually lead to funding opportunities. The ability to extensively monitor civil unrest in real time assists in the planning and decision-making process.

- Personal and Corporate Donations When the Town of Linn started our program, we also wrote donation requests to the local community and received help towards the purchase of new equipment. In addition to local community organizations, restaurants and even individual residents, another opportunity for drone program funding is through larger corporate stores such as Target, Walgreens, Walmart, Costco, and others. Many of these corporations have a foundation set for giving back to local communities.
- Additional Funding Often, as is the case with Town of Linn, the drone program will grow to assist in multiple parts of public service. Drones can be used to

inspect rooflines in town buildings; monitor road and bridge conditions; and may help with waterway management projects. Drone programs can also closely partner with local schools to show students how technology is used in law enforcement today. When the Town of Linn began to use the drone program in cross-channel applications, the agency received local donations from area residents and business owners. This, in turn, also helped with public perception of the program as residents saw the overall benefits of these tools.

Where You Work Can Make a Difference – Some states allow drug forfeiture money to be adopted into a program which will be used to aid in drug prevention programs and equipment. Since drones are widely used for assisting in intel and location of drug interdiction efforts, talk to your local city government officials and court about approval to create or expand your program and to use these funds for equipment.

When the Town of Linn Police Department reviewed work with the board and its citizens, the agency was able to show how it leveraged technology to assist officers to perform their jobs more efficiently and safely. Meanwhile, they increased perception and participation from within the community. With time and investment, your agency can make building and upgrading the drone program a seamless part of your workflow.

### Step 3: Choose the Right Hardware

**Airframes** – Airframes will greatly depend on the type of work you plan to do and the total available program budget. For instance, if your agency's primary function is search and rescue, and you have at least three or more pilots, you can equip your drone program with at least three small platforms, such as the Autel EVO II Dual or DJI Mavic 2 Enterprise Advanced.

Budget constraints are a big reason why we see aircraft like the ANAFI or the Mavic Air getting a lot of use by public safety agencies. While they weren't originally designed for enterprise or agency use, they're reliable and less expensive than larger commercial-grade systems, making them more accessible.

**Payloads** – The payload makes all the difference in finding your target. In search and rescue situations, it can even be the difference between life and death. In most cases, you want a 640 resolution thermal sensor at the minimum. With a limited bud-

- Police Grants Help (PoliceOne.com) (https://tinyurl.com/msv29x6s) – This resource allows police departments to search federal, state, foundation, and corporate grants available to your community, along with tracking and submitting grant applications.
- The Office of Community Oriented Policing Service (COPS) (https://cops.usdoj.gov/) – COPS is a leading community policing expert at the US Department of Justice and has invested over \$14 billion in community policing since Congress established the office in 1994.
- 3. First Responder Grants (https://tinyurl.com/4e6npkaf) This resource helps public safety agencies or first responder organizations locate, develop, apply, and win supplemental grant funding from federal, state, local, private, and corporate funding resources involved in homeland defense.

- EMS Grants Help (EMS1.com) (https://tinyurl.com/4cu3t74s) – This resource allows emergency services to search federal, state, foundation, and corporate grants available to your community, along with tracking and submitting grant applications.
- National Institute of Justice (https://nij.ojp.gov/funding) – The NIJ awards grants and cooperative agreements for various research, development and evaluation projects and fellowship programs through competitive solicitations.
- Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Program (https://tinyurl.com/239szpjn) – The Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Program assists high threat,

high-density urban areas in efforts to build and sustain the capabilities necessary to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism.

### Additional Grants and Funding Options

- 1. Homeland Security Funding: Homeland Security funding is currently the most widely used grant source for police drones. If your equipment will be used for search and rescue, crowd monitoring, bomb investigation, or domestic or international terrorism events that threaten your community, you can apply for Homeland Security Grants at https://tinyurl.com/bdf88nub
- 2. Byrne Justice Assistance Grants: Justice Assistance Grants (JAG) (https://tinyurl.com/2p8tvxd9) are the largest sources of grant funding to support law enforcement equipment and training. Many local municipalities across the country receive a local JAG allocation (https://tinyurl.com/2brmz6jr) directly from the federal government based on their share of their state's three year violent crime average.
- 3. Federal Highway Traffic Safety Grants: Are you planning to use the drone for accident investigations? Then, your state's highway traffic safety funds would be a great source. Federal dollars are passed down to states through the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (https://tinyurl.com/2p8xn8ef).
- 4. HIDTA and Project Safe Neighborhood Funding: Is your agency part of a multiagency task force in a High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) (https://tinyurl.com/4s5dy32s) or Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN) (https://tinyurl.com/9j4bbm82) district? If so, drones can be a valuable asset in your drug interdiction and violent crime reduction strategy.
- 5. Corporate and Private Foundations: Most large corporations across the U.S. have foundations or "giving programs" offering grants or donations based on their established priorities. Often, the priority is supporting the community where they are located.
- 6. Asset Forfeiture Funds: Many police agencies are using asset forfeiture dollars to support drone equipment, accessories and training. Speak with your department leadership and encourage them to consider allocating dollars from this fund to cover your purchase.

### **Final Tip**

Know Your Grant Restrictions: Some federal grant programs list drones under the "controlled equipment" category and place certain restrictions on using federal funding to cover the purchase. The restrictions have been lifted or relaxed in the last year, but understand and follow the new guidelines set out by FEMA and the Bureau of Justice Assistance when using these grant sources for your purchase.

get, we recommend choosing the highest quality airframe and investing in your second unit the following year.

### Accessories:

- Power and Battery When it comes to accessories, you cannot go wrong with many spare batteries, as well as additional chargers. Power and battery life are crucial for proper performance. You'll want the option to charge batteries while out in the field. It is a best practice to always keep at least five batteries per airframe.
- Auxiliary Lighting Additionally, invest in auxiliary lighting which can be mounted on the drone. Systems including the Fire House or Fox Fury lighting units are a benefit to have onboard. In many situations, especially when providing overwatch on scenes, it assists the ground units by serving as an aerial work light over the scene and allowing staff to be hands-free when necessary. It can also help guide them out of remote areas.
- Constant Charging Avoid having to ground your unit because of low battery power. It's best practice to charge batteries throughout a job, recharging your original battery when you use the

spares. Of course, battery charge time is dependent on outside temperatures and the type of battery charger you are using. You want to avoid having to ground your unit because of low battery power.

- Additional Tools Finally, you can never have too many memory cards, readers or extra connection cables. Keep your controller connected to your table, a good landing pad (or two) and a solid tablet holder. These tools will make your program run smoothly and efficiently.
- Drone Responder Line TruckVault offers a line of drone command center solutions to help departments integrate drone technology. They offer a variety

of drawer systems which secure and store both drones and batteries within the vehicle compartment, keeping them ready for quick deployment. Integrated displays are available for command or operations staff and radio panels help to keep multiple operators in the command loop. Seven different designs are available, ranging from a simple single drawer Magnum height system (serving as a basic secure storage solution) to a full command center equipped with a monitor, power package, radio panel, and pull-out table.

### Step 4: Settle on Software

The software you choose is entirely dependent on your end-game. If you are doing accident reconstruction, software such as Pix4D or SkyBrowse are important and should be included in the yearly maintenance budget. For editing photos and videos, having a computer which can keep up with software such as Adobe Photoshop and Premiere is also important. Many gaming computers can handle the job well.

### Step 5: Finalize Insurance

In the initial stages of your drone program, talk to your municipality's insurance company. It's important to finalize details such as understanding what coverage they

Designed in collaboration with some of the world's top counterterrorism teams and produced by NATO allies, the Sky-Hero LOKI Mk2 Tactical sUAS is purpose-built for tactical operations. Singled out by a panel of experts for its contribution to the homeland security industry, the LOKI was recently honored with a prestigious Innovation Award at Milipol Paris 2021.

Capable of autonomous hovering and able to operate in complete darkness, LOKI is built to self-stabilize and hold its position in the air without the need for flight control input. This allows the operator to focus on searching and scouting without having to worry about flying an unstable drone. LOKI also features a highly sensitive day/night + IR camera which seamlessly transitions from bright light to complete darkness and allows for visibility in zero light. Its front and bottom selectable and dimmable IR LEDs ensure complete visual clarity regardless of lighting conditions, while its onboard HD microphone captures sound in any environment.

The exterior of the LOKI Mk2 is purpose-built to withstand the full contact nature of indoor flight. In the event of a crash, it has the ability to self-right in all four directions and its ruggedized system allows it to withstand crashes without interruptions in signal or operational capabilities. The LOKI Mk2 features a user repairable design for manageable parts replacement or repair and comes equipped with an extended battery which provides 16 minutes of flight and up to six hours of video and sound transmission while perched.

Due to the austere nature of many tactical operations, LOKI is built to operate in a completely denied environment. It does not require GPS, cellular service, Wi-Fi, or any other external service to operate. This allows LOKI to operate underground, in high-rise buildings, tunnels and in other extremely remote locations where a lack of internet service or poor cellular service

offer (whether it's for hardware and/or personnel), what the deductible is and what happens should they need to investigate an accident.

would deny other drones the ability to fly. An analog-based communications system provides ultralow latency which prevents lagging, ensuring real-time intelligence relay to operators as well as complete accuracy in flight. The LOKI Mk2 also protects operational security by not recording onboard video or images, preventing data security loss in the case of drone loss or capture. Secondary viewers can stream real-time footage while the encrypted video feature eliminates concerns of signal interception.

The LOKI Mk2 is likely the most readily deployable drone on the market with a ground-to-air deployment time measured in seconds - not minutes or hours. It is ideal for rapid and surreptitious deployment and is able to be hand launched, even from a moving vehicle. LOKI Mk2 is operated through a custom-built, standalone ground controller which can operate four devices simultaneously. Like the sUAS, the controller requires no GPS, Wi-Fi or cellular service to function. The LOKI Mk2 can also carry an array of tactical payloads, from alternative cameras to diversionary devices, light and laser packages, and breaching payloads.

All of the LOKI Mk2's capabilities were designed with a singular goal in mind: to protect operator safety. When the LOKI Mk2 is serving as a scout, team members aren't forced to make the tough decision to enter a potentially hazardous site, such as an attic, basement, vehicle, or building with a barricaded suspect or other threat. The drone acts as a powerful de-escalation tool, allowing operators to avoid potentially lethal confrontations by providing real-time and accurate scouting without risk to the stack.

Since its release, the LOKI Mk2 has enhanced the operations of over 1,000 teams across six continents, 47 US states and all ten Canadian provinces. This includes some of the top counterterrorism units in the world. A tactical drone team leader described LOKI as follows: "The best thing about LOKI Mk2 is [that] it just works. In any environment or any circumstance, LOKI can get our team the information we need. It can be up and flying in seconds, and it can fly anywhere."

LOKI Mk2 requires minimal training and is usually operational for a new team with just a few hours of practice. Even for more experienced pilots of the LOKI Mk2, the drone consistently pushes the limits of what a sUAS can accomplish. It can fly into locations and circumstances which are almost impossible for other drones, such as suspended ceilings, attics, under furniture, and into pipes and crawl spaces.

Because LOKI is designed to operate "in the stack," Sky-Hero has partnered with AARDVARK and PROJECT7 to develop a series of LOKI accessories which promote mission integration, including a backpack system, wrist viewer gauntlet and vest mounted GCS carriage system. The Project7 ILB-LOKI pack has made the LOKI Mk2 more portable than any drone before it, housing two LOKIs, ten batteries, a GCS, battery chargers, spare parts, and more – all on the operator's back.

### Step 6: Public Perception and Transparency

As your drone program grows, it's important to get buy-in from the local community. Educating residents by implementing a school program to showcase drones to students can be a great way to improve public perception of the program. For example, it can be beneficial to show the public how drones help with roadway management projects or how drones take aerial images of roads which need repair. All of this gives residents a different perspective on this public program.

Another great idea could be to put the drones on display at every local fair and expo in order to show residents what the program does. Look at every opportunity to demonstrate the capabilities of the drone program and how it's an important tool. Consider utilizing the drone program for other local needs – a search for a lost pet





or to take aerial images of a Scout troop. These positive experiences for your department and the community can also serve as a good training experience for the team.

### Step 7: Measure Success of the Program

The first time your drone program helps find a missing person, identify a road issue or aids in infrastructure repair, the drone program has already proven its value. In the dynamic environment of emergency operations, any time the drone can mitigate the human risk factor counts as a success. After you demonstrate the value of the program to the community, the more help you will receive with program acceptance and future potential donations. P&SN

# NEW GUNS and GEAR for 2022

### **MIKE BOYLE**

## **P&SN** Presents Its 31st Annual Roundup Covering New Firearms and Equipment of Most Interest to Law Enforcement

or more than 40 years, the SHOT Show has served as the launching point for new guns and related equipment of interest to the law enforcement professional. This year's show was held in the Venetian Expo Center in Las Vegas and, to say the least, it was a bit different from those of the past. Last year, the show was cancelled because of the COVID-19 pandemic and, instead, we were provided with a virtual SHOT Show event. We were optimistic that this year's SHOT Show would be bigger and better than ever, with over 2,000 exhibitors participating. However, at the last minute, an uptick in the pandemic threw a monkey wrench into the plan. Multiple numbers of manufacturers, both large and small, chose not to attend because of health concerns for their employees and that certainly put an odd spin on the show. Others had a much diminished presence.

Nonetheless, the show was a success. In 2021, there were very few new products introduced because the manufacturers had their hands full trying to keep up with the unprecedented demand for firearms and ammunition. Although we are not out of the woods yet, things have improved a bit and there were a number of new guns to check out, along with ammunition and other accessories. Let's take a look at some new products due to hit the market in 2022.



### **BERETTA®**

Since it was introduced in the 1970s. the Beretta Model 92 has evolved into one of the most iconic pistols of all time. In the M9 format, this pistol served as the standard sidearm of the US Armed Forces for over 30 years. This year, Beretta has introduced two variants built on this popular platform. First up is the M9A4 Centurion. The Centurion features a fulllength grip frame, but with a slightly shorter slide which reduces total length to 8.3 inches. The most notable feature of this pistol is a slide cut for the mounting of a red dot optic. Five different plates will be available from Beretta so the end user can affix just about any of the popular red dot optics. The M9A4 sports an FDE finish and is chambered for the world standard 9mm Parabellum.

Another new entry is the M92XRDO

Compact. Last year, Beretta introduced the full-size M92XRDO and it is no surprise that a smaller copy ideally suited for concealed carry followed. Overall length is trimmed back to 7.75 inches and a slightly abbreviated grip frame aids discreet carry. The F style decocker/safety lever is standard, but the pistol can easily be converted to the G decocker-only type. Slim Vertec grip panels, a Picatinny rail and front slide serrations are standard.

### **B&T USA**

The law enforcement community may not be all that familiar with B&T, but this firm continues to push the envelope on the development of cutting edge firearms and suppressors. Founded in 1991, B&T AG (formerly known as Brugger & Thomet) turns out a number of innova-

tive weapon systems and, in 2019, was awarded a contract from the US Army for their APC 9K. This is the first submachine gun the Army had purchased in over 50 years as the B&T submission competed favorably over models submitted by more established manufacturers. Law enforcement agencies using their products include the Miami Beach, FL, Police Department; the Westchester County, NY, Police Department; and the Lake County, IN, Sheriff's Department. These firearms are manufactured in Switzerland and brought to the US by B&T USA.

At the recent SHOT Show, I had the opportunity to examine their SPC9 (Special Purpose Carbine) and came away favorably impressed. Unlike some other carbines, the SPC9 is not an adaptation of a sporting arm, but an entirely new design optimized for law enforcement applications. The SPC9 combines many of the attributes of the MP5, APC9 and the AR platforms and it offers excellent ergonomics and handling characteristics in a versatile delivery system. The SPC9 utilizes a unique delayed blowback action which uses a hydraulic buffer to tame recoil and enhance performance while suppressed.

Although short barrel rifles have encroached on the use of SMGs and 9mm pistol caliber carbines, they can still fill a very useful niche. In 9mm format, the SPC9 is much easier to effectively suppress. The folding stock SPC9 PDW would also prove very useful in tight places or vehicles.

### **FN AMERICA, LLC**

FN America, LLC is a most unique firm which manufactures rifles, pistols, shotguns, and less-lethal launchers for the law enforcement market. In my experience, all have proven to be top-shelf.

One of the bigger surprises of the SHOT Show was the reintroduction of the High Power pistol. Rather than just put out an exact copy of the original, FN went to great lengths to update this classic design. Rendered from all steel, the new High Power features ambidex-

trous controls and magazines with a 17 round capacity. The magazine disconnect safety has been eliminated which further enhances the crisp single-action trigger. Models will include copies in stainless steel, black or FDE.

About 20 years ago, FN introduced the 303 Less Lethal Launcher which has proven to be in a class of its own. This year, the 303 Tactical Launcher has been given a number of upgrades, including various options in stock configurations to better suit specific needs. Fully adjustable polymer sights are standard and are mounted to a rail which accepts red dot sights, lasers and white lights. The air operating system has also been improved to reduce maintenance.

But, of late, the biggest buzz about FN is the fact that the LAPD has recently moved to adopt the 509<sup>®</sup> MRD-LE as their standard duty pistol. Without question, this is huge. The commercial market typically follows trends similar to law enforcement and having one of the largest and most prestigious departments in the country select your pistol may very well put you over the top. GLOCK<sup>®</sup>, Smith & Wesson<sup>®</sup> and SIG SAUER<sup>®</sup> have typically enjoyed the biggest piece of the law enforcement pie in recent years, but now a very worthy competitor has made a big impact.

The FN 509 MRD-LE is a very well put together gun which came through a grueling 20,000+ round test without a malfunction. This 9mm striker-fired pistol is optics ready with suppressor height sights and features a four inch barrel. Magazine capacity is 17 rounds. No doubt, we will be hearing of more agencies taking a hard look at the 509 MRD-LE in the near future.

### **MOSSBERG®**

Mossberg is a name we typically associate with shotguns rather than handguns, but they hit the jackpot a few years ago with the introduction of their micro-compact semiautomatic pistol. New this year is a downsized version called the MC2sc<sup>™</sup>, a really small pistol well suited to deep concealment. This striker-fired design is built on a polymer frame with a black DLC finish, stainless steel slide and barrel.

Total length of the MC2sc is 6.25 inches and it tips the scales at 19.5 ounces unloaded. Two magazines are provided which yield a total capacity of either 11+1 or 14+1 total rounds. The MP2sc is optics

ready and 3 dot white sights are standard, although there is a model with TRUGLO® Tritium sights available as a factory option. An integrated trigger blade safety is standard; however, a model with a crossbolt safety can also be had. The flat profile trigger features a tactile reset and breaks at about 5.5 pounds.

### SAVAGE ARMS

Another big surprise for 2022 is the introduction of the Savage Stance micro-compact. Although most people associate Savage with rifles and shotguns, at one time, they were a cutting edge manufacturer of pistols.

The Savage Stance is a small, very thin, 9mm pistol designed for discreet carry. Like many other pistols of this type, it is a striker-fired design with a user-friendly, crisp trigger with a short reset. The slide is made of stainless steel with a Melonite finish and is mated to a stainless steel chassis with a glass filled nylon grip frame. Sights are a snag-free design and consist of an orange dot front with two white dots on the rear sight. The Stance will ship with a flush mount, seven round magazine and an eight round magazine. An extended ten round copy will soon be available.

### **SMITH & WESSON**

Last year, Smith & Wesson introduced the M&P<sup>®</sup> Shield<sup>™</sup> Plus which played to rave reviews. In the hand, the Shield Plus really didn't feel much different than the original Shield, nor did it compromise concealment qualities in any way. The good news, of course, is that the Shield Plus yielded a significant boost with 10 +1 round capacity in a flush seated magazine and 12 +1 in a slightly extended version.

Just when you thought it was safe to go back in the water, S&W has put yet another spin on the Shield. New this year is a Shield Plus chambered for a brand-new cartridge called the 30 Super Carry. Developed in cooperation with Federal<sup>®</sup>, the 30 Super Carry launches a 100-grain .312 diameter bullet at 1200 fps. Muzzle energy is roughly on par with the 9mm Parabellum.

So what, if any, advantage does this hold? Because the cartridge case is of a lesser diameter, more rounds can be held in the magazine and the Shield Plus so chambered will have a capacity of 12+1 or 15+1 rounds. Federal and sister companies Remington, Speer and CCI will load both duty quality and practice ammunition.

Another surprise from Smith & Wesson was the introduction of the CSX<sup>™</sup> 9mm micro-pistol. The CSX

stands out from the rest of the pack for a number of reasons – most notable is the fact that it is a single-action pistol which can be carried cocked and locked. Another major deviation from the pack is that it is built on an aluminum alloy rather than a polymer frame.

A pair of magazines completes the package, including ten round and 12 round sticks. At a mere 6.1 inches long, the CSX is ideal for users looking for a small 9mm hideout pistol.

There has been a popular demand for an M&P pistol in 10mm and that is now a reality. The M&P M2.0<sup>™</sup> represents a number of improvements in this popular line and I was especially impressed when handling the new 10mm copy. High on my list is the fact that the M&P 10mm actually fit my medium-size hand very well. Two versions will be available: one with a four inch barrel and the other with a slightly longer 4.6 inch barrel. The pistols are optics ready and will come with suppressor height sights. The magazine capacity is 15 rounds.

Thirty years ago, the 10mm and handguns built for it were pushed to the back burner by the .40 S&W. In recent years, the 10mm has enjoyed a spike in popularity while the .40 S&W's star has crashed. For 2022, Winchester has introduced a new 10mm load in their USA Ready Defense line with a 170-grain Hex-Vent hollow point bullet. It is unlikely that 10mm handguns will ever be huge, but they are often in use by law enforcement officers who may have to deal with large, unpleasant animals as well as criminals.

Some people would lead you to believe that shotguns are obsolete as a viable police weapon system. I would submit that their role is changing, but they will long be part of the law enforcement scene.

Introduced at the tail end of last year, the M&P 12 Shotgun is a horse of a different color. While most police shotguns are an adaptation of a sporting design, the bullpup, pump-action M&P 12 is indeed very different. With a total length of 27.8 inches, the M&P 12 is designed so that the user can maneuver in very tight places such as a hallway. Twin magazine tubes are utilized and a button switch is used to select the proper magazine. One can load one tube with buck shot and the other with rifled slugs and select the optimum load for the situation. Capacity is six, three inch shells per tube or seven 2 ¾ inch shells. The M&P 12 can also handle the new abbreviated length minishells

A Picatinny rail sits on top for the mounting of iron sights or optics. Both modified and improved cylinder choke tubes, as well as a wrench, are provided and any Remington compatible tube may be used with the M&P 12. The safety selector is ambidextrous.

### **SPRINGFIELD ARMORY®**

A few months back, Springfield Armory introduced the SA-35<sup>™</sup>, an updated version of the John Browning/Dieudonne Saive P35 pistol. For those who favor steel and walnut over polymer, it doesn't get any better than this timeless design.

In designing the SA-35, Springfield Armory made a number of improvements, yet still captured the character of the original. Forged steel parts are utilized in its construction along with improved ergonomics and enhanced controls. The magazine disconnect safety has been discarded and the trigger of the SA-35 is superior to that of the original. Better sights and an improved feed ramp for reliable function with modern ammunition is also part of the package. The magazine capacity has been increased to 15 rounds.

Two years ago, Springfield Armory launched the XD-M<sup>®</sup> Elite Series which boasted a number of refinements over the standard models. The line has continued to grow and, a few months ago, the 3.8 inch Compact OSP<sup>™</sup> Series 10mm and the .45 ACP models were added to the line. These pistols feature aggressive slide serrations, match grade barrels, a removable magwell, plus an ambidextrous slide stop. Trigger action on most striker-fired pistols is subpar; however, the flat face  $META^{T}$  system is in a league of its own.

These pistols can be had as optics ready or complete with a HEX<sup>™</sup> Dragonfly optic. Magazine capacity is 11 rounds in the 10mm and ten rounds in the .45 caliber version.

Another new addition to the Springfield line is the Hellion<sup>™</sup> rifle. Based on the VHS bullpup which has been in service with the Croatian Armed Forces for several years, the Hellion is a compact, semiauto design chambered for the 5.56 NATO cartridge. Because the action is located behind the trigger group, the Hellion is a handy 28.25



inches in length, even with a 16 inch barrel.

The controls are ambidextrous and work in concert with a reversible case ejection system to allow the Hellion to

be fired from either shoulder. That is a very important quality for this left-handed shooter. A set of rugged iron sights are standard and red dot or magnifying optics can be easily affixed to the Picatinny top rail. The polymer forend contains nine M-Lok<sup>®</sup> slots for the mounting of accessories. A 30 round PMAG comes with the Hellion and it will accommodate standard AR pattern magazines.

Bullpup rifles do afford a number of advantages over more traditional rifle configurations. Clearly working a tight spot is much easier and the full-length 16 inch barrel offers much better external and terminal ballistics when compared to a more conventional SBR or a submachine gun which fires handgun cartridges. The Hellion is indeed different, but it appears to have much to offer.

### **LIGHTS AND RED DOTS**

White lights and red dot optics remain a hot ticket for 2022. This category continues to evolve at a very rapid pace and I have identified just a few of the new products which might interest the law enforcement professional.

Streamlight® offers an extensive line of weapon mounted lights and this year's new offerings are designed around smaller pistols designed for discreet carry. New this year is a TLR-7<sup>®</sup> Sub for the Springfield Hellcat®. This innovative WML puts out 500 lumens of intense white light and runs off of a single CR123A battery. A TLR-6 is now available for the Taurus GX4<sup>™</sup>, as well as many other small pistols without an accessory rail. It, too, features an ambidextrous, rear mounted switch. It also includes a red laser aimer for target acquisition. Power is supplied by a pair of CR-1/3N batteries and the light does not have to be removed from the pistol when there is a need to replace them. More information and images of these new items are featured in the "Product Highlight" column in this issue which can be found on pages 10-11.

There is no getting around the fact that red dot optics are the wave of the future and use by both departments and individual officers is in full swing. In the not so distant past, the cost of a quality red dot optic was as much as, or even more than, the pistol it was mounted on. That has all changed and there are now quality options which can be had that won't break the bank.

AMERIGLO®, an industry leader in traditional pistol sights, recently intro-

duced the Haven<sup>™</sup>. This new offering is a very well-thought-out design with a large window and a 3.5 MOA red dot. The Haven also features an adjustable LED and mounts to the pistol using the popular RMR footprint. The fact that you can replace the side loading CR2032 battery from the Haven without removing it from the pistol is another big plus.

Holosun is an extremely innovative company turning out red dot optics and their new SCS (Solar Charging Sight) is indeed a game changer. Instead of a traditional internal battery, the SLS uses a solar cell for power. This enabled Holosun to build a red dot with a much shorter body that it can be co-witnessed to the factory iron sights. The cell is good for 20,000 hours of runtime. An innovative auto adjust feature of the SCS is designed to compensate for shortcomings when using a white light in conjunction with the optic. The Holosun SCS will be available for a number of popular pistols in use by law enforcement.

Also new from Holosun is the EPS and EPS Carry. These optics feature an enclosed emitter for better protection from the elements and debris. The EPS Carry features a rear sight which should allow the user to use the factory front to co-witness. These units utilize the same mounting footprint as the 507/407K.

Technology continues to march on. The gear we have available today is light years beyond the six shot revolver which I carried when I first got into this racket and we can expect more innovation in the future. When that happens, you can read about it here. **P&SN**







Do I have to itemize my stolen property?... Did you steal anything in 2021? Did you take a bribe? If you did, the IRS wants you to report it on your taxes. The requirements can be found at IRS.gov amid other missives to report income earned from jobs in the "gig economy" and what to do about taxable alimony payments. "If you steal property, you must report its fair market value in your income in the year you steal it unless you return it to its rightful owner in the same year," read the provision for stolen property. What if you dealt drugs or engaged in other crimes? The IRS publication says to note your earnings on Schedule 1 of your 1040 form, "or on schedule C ... if from your self-employment activity." And, don't forget to report any bribes or kickbacks you took in the course of doing business. They must also be reported on Schedule 1 or Schedule C. (Does it go both ways? Can I get a tax exemption on property stolen from me?)

Technically speaking, they got their cash back right away ... Delaware State Police reported that a 44-year-old man robbed a New Castle County bank and then tried to deposit the cash using the ATM outside the bank. State police arrested the accused after they say he robbed a Wells Fargo bank. The accused reportedly handed a teller a note saying he was robbing the bank. The 25-year-old woman then handed over an undisclosed amount of cash and the accused left the bank. "The suspect fled the bank on foot and, once outside, he made a deposit in the ATM on the exterior of the building," state police said. The man then tried to hide behind a shopping center where state troopers caught up to him and arrested him. (He probably was trying to avoid one of those overdraft fees.)

This should re-kindle their passion... Neighbors in Cajeme, Sonora, Mexico, called the police to report a domestic disturbance. When officers arrived, they found a woman holding a knife which she had used to attack her husband. The husband was not seriously injured and he was able to explain to the police exactly what had transpired. He said his jealous wife had been going through his phone when she found a picture of him in a compromising position with a younger woman. He said she then flew into a rage and attacked
